With these strict requirements comes an increased development cost which creates market conditions that do not always support the profitable sale of the propane systems for market- driven prices. Although this is the case, grant funding has made the vehicles displayed at this event available for purchase at a reasonable price. Other states and countries have been successfully using propane as a motor fuel since the 1930’s. In Europe it is called, “Auto Gas.”
